Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B - 12th / 13th June 2021

Dear friends,

In the light of the impending downfall of Jerusalem, the prophet Ezekiel speaks about a new beginning brought about by God which will come about through the agency of a 'chosen one' (namely, the *Messiah*). How this process starts, and unfolds, is compared to the way a great tree – a cedar - begins life as a tiny shoot. As the cedar tree is symbolic of David's kingdom, the prophecy contained in the 1st Reading indicates that David's kingdom will not only be restored to its former glory but will be fulfilled in the kingdom of

be restored to its former glory but will be fulfilled in the kingdom of the Messiah, the Christ. We are also reminded that this new kingdom can only be brought about through God's direction and power.

The gospel is very much connected with the 1st Reading. Here, Jesus explains through two parables, how the Kingdom of God works. He says, the Kingdom of God is like a man who plants the seed into the ground and goes to sleep. The farmer's job is to sow the seed. He can do nothing to make the plant grow. His staying awake, his worrying about whether the seed will sprout will not help the process; he must be patient and wait in hope. Initially, after having sown the seed, nothing much is happening on the outside, but the miracle of growth is taking place within. This is a good metaphor for the spiritual life!

When we pray or do good works nothing may seem to be happening, but we need to wait patiently for the Lord to do His work in His way.

In the second parable Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to the little mustard seed that grows into the largest shrub so that the birds of the air can shelter and nest in it. It is in humble beginnings that great things are achieved. When we allow it, the kingdom of God silently unfolds within us. Its growth is invisible but certain when God is in charge. Sometimes we find it hard to believe that because we want tangible proof and speedy action. However, God works differently, God power feels like powerlessness to us, it feels mediocre and, sometimes, a non-event.

We are called to be patient and to sow good seeds and leave the rest to God. The contrast between the smallness of the seed with the enormity of the tree indicates that small beginnings can have a large impact!

MY SPONSORED MARATHON WALK

On Friday 9th July, I am taking part in a marathon walk (26.2 miles.) The route goes due North-East and then West in mid-Essex, from Little Waltham (near Chelmsford), via Braintree, to Start Hill (near Stansted.) It follows parts of the Essex Way footpath and all of the Flitch Way. It is estimated that this will take me 11 hours to complete, on a 'hopefully' warm day. By taking part in this walk, I will overcome considerable personal challenge and maybe some hardship along the way, and it will be the longest distance that I have ever walked, and my greatest physical and mental achievement yet. I decided that I wanted to support a charitable cause, to give my walk even more of a purpose. I recently heard that the son of my Reception Teacher, who taught me at St. George's, is very seriously ill and they need to raise £60,000 to have Proton Beam Therapy in Germany. Her little boy, Henry, is only 3 years old, and it made me want to help him and his family, so I decided that any small amount of money that I could raise, should be donated to this cause.
