Epiphany of the Lord

Matthew's gospel for this weekend is loaded with symbolism and metaphors. There are two important metaphors which pertain to the spiritual life that I would like to underscore; the **light** of the star and **journey**.

Light, as a metaphor, appears in many religions, and is representative of divine presence. We hear that, using the light of the star, the magi went off in search of the ultimate and source of all light: the fullness of divine presence in Jesus. But even the magi themselves are symbolic figures. These were thought to be people who studied the movement of the heavens, not so much from a scientific perspective, but from a 'religious' perspective in that the heavens revealed divine things. Hence, they're motivation to follow the light of the star.

When they reached their destination, the magi left behind the worship of the stars, and bowed down to worship the one who made the stars, the sun

and life itself!

This brings me on to the other metaphor which I would like to underscore, which is **journey**. The magi made a journey to find Christ and it couldn't have been an easy one, as travel in those days was difficult and dangerous; in certain places you might well be 'taking your life in your hands'. But, from what they sensed in the heavens and from within themselves, they were inspired and compelled to make this one, important journey.

We are all on a spiritual journey to find Christ and it is not always an easy one. Sometimes we have to make sacrifices and walk a difficult and challenging path. But like the magi, our focus should always be Christ. Communion with God doesn't 'fall into our laps'; we've got to want it and seek it – just like the magi.

I pray that in our journey and search for God we may be diligent and courageous, faithful and determined, in order that we may find that greatest treasure of all, the fullness of God's presence in Jesus Christ our Lord.

I shall be taking my post-Christmas break this Sunday afternoon and will be away for a couple of weeks. I'll be leaving you in the very capable hands of the wonderful Fr Martin Joyce and our lovely Sharon (make sure she behaves herself; when the cat is away....).
