Welcome to the May e-bulletin about our work together to evangelise our diocese in the context of our **Vision Document: Shaping Our Future**.

Parish Partnerships have shared many prayers and conversations in recent weeks. It has been a privilege for me to share in some of them. Thank you.

People are actively arranging for groups that exist in each parish to meet across the Parish Partnership. SVP, KSC, CWL, Legion of Mary, Catenians and many others can all work together to bring people together as a partnership and to achieve more than they can in individual parishes. I have heard the phrase “we can do much more together” on several occasions. I am sure it is true.

At least one Parish Partnership has actively taken the **Vision Document: Shaping Our Future** to the young people in the partnership. They held a wide ranging and really positive discussion in their confirmation group and are now looking at practical ways to bring their ideas to life across the partnership. Another is bringing together all those involved in Youth work/ministry across the partnership and working towards youth events for all young people in the partnership.

The idea of a **Parish Partnership Thanksgiving Day** is catching on. Bringing people together from across the partnership in order to celebrate and give thanks for all the good things and to meet new people from other parishes in the partnership is a great idea.

A few are either already producing, or just about to produce, a newsletter insert or a separate document detailing progress, successes and challenges that is common to all parishes in the Parish Partnership. These are great ways to keep more people informed/involved.

I am aware that in some places the challenges facing us are proving more difficult than in others. When people are asked to work together in new ways and with a new focus there are bound to be challenges and difficulties. How we deal with those is something for us all to reflect upon. Priests and lay people working together, recognising the gifts of one another and the special and distinct callings of each other, will be a powerful symbol of our church working together to evangelise our diocese. I am always willing to help when asked to do so and within Cathedral House and at Governance level we continue to explore and develop new ways to help and support you in all you do. Currently new payroll systems are bedding in and a new HR provision is being introduced to support work in parishes and partnerships. Support is being given where partnerships are exploring new uses for property or when a sale of property is being considered.
